## Hepatitis C

Treatment in federal prison

17% of federal prisoners have Hepatitis C. If you have Hepatitis C, you are eligible for treatment.

## New and effective Hepatitis C treatment is available

You can access it in prison.

Untreated Hepatitis C can lead to liver disease and death. Many people have Hepatitis C even though they never used injection drugs.

Newer treatments now available in Canada are much more effective than older Hepatitis C drugs. They are also easier to take because they are oral medication (no needles), have fewer side effects and are taken for a shorter time. Even people with cirrhosis and other liver problems may now be eligible for treatment.<sup>1</sup>

Most people have no symptoms, so you could have Hepatitis C and not know it. Hepatitis C rates are 260 times higher in prison that in the community.<sup>2</sup> If you are concerned that you might have Hepatitis C, ask the institutional doctor to be tested.

If you have Hepatitis C, you can ask the institutional doctor for treatment. With treatment, your liver may start to repair itself.<sup>3</sup>

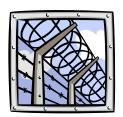
